Certification of Meningococcal Compliance

In Compliance with Oklahoma Statutes, Title 70, §3243

Oklahoma Statutes, Title 70, § 3243, requires that all students who are first time enrollees in any public or private postsecondary institution in this state and who reside in on-campus student housing shall be vaccinated against meningococcal disease. Institutions of higher education must provide the student or the student's parents or other legal representative detailed information on the risks associated with meningococcal disease and on the availability and effectiveness of any vaccine.

The statute permits the student or, if the student is a minor, the student's parent or other legal representative, to sign a written waiver stating that the student received and reviewed the information provided on the risks associated with meningococcal disease and on the availability and effectiveness of any vaccine, and has chosen not to be or not to have the student vaccinated.

Students should contact their personal physician or the local health department if they would like more information about meningococcal disease and the vaccination or if they would like to receive the vaccination. **CAMERON UNIVERSITY
CONTRACT FOR STUDENT HOUSING SERVICES**

Conditions of Contract

The Contract for Student Housing Services is an agreement between Cameron University, which is called the University, and the Student whose name appears on the contract who is called the Student. The contract covers Residence life services for the 2008-2009 academic year. The Student is responsible for carefully reviewing all information including the terms and conditions before signing and submitting the contract to Cameron University.

1. **SCOPE OF SERVICE.** Included within the scope of services covered by this contract are room occupancy, food service, internet connection, and cable and telephone services of Residence Hall or Apartment occupancy. These must remain in effect throughout the term of occupancy. Termination of this contract may also terminate the Student's right to participate in meal plans offered by Cameron University.
2. **TERM OF OCCUPANCY.** The terms are indicated in this contract. The Student may occupy the Residence Hall or Apartment in accordance with the Dates of Occupancy published within this contract. Students convicted of a felony must receive special permission to reside in the Residence Hall or Apartment. The Residence Hall or Apartment may also be occupied between semesters under a separate contract. Contact the Office of Residence Life for more information.
3. **CHARGES AND PAYMENT.** The University establishes charges for housing, food service, telephone service, cable, Residence Hall or Apartment activity fees, and other charges incidental to Residence living. The Student agrees to pay these charges to the University at the times set forth. Failure to pay charges at published installment dates will stop meal privileges and no refund will be given for missed meals. Late fees will also be assessed for delinquent payments. If the account remains delinquent, the University will proceed with eviction and collection procedures. Any unpaid balances including tuition or fees may be taken out of the student's housing deposit at the time of his/her checkout.

A \$200 deposit is required for any Residence Hall or Apartment. If a contract is cancelled after July 15, 2007, the deposit is not refundable.
4. **CARE OF FACILITIES.** The Student shall use reasonable diligence in the care, cleaning and maintenance of his or her room and common areas of the Residence Hall or Apartment and shall vacate the premises in the same good condition which existed when the occupancy began, reasonable wear and tear accepted. No alteration may be made to University property without the prior written consent of the Director of Residence Life. The Student agrees to pay, upon demand, for any damage to University property that results from the negligence, carelessness, accident of the Student or the Student's guest. If the identity of those responsible for the damage to University property cannot be determined after investigation, the Director of Residence Life at his or her discretion may apportion the cost to repair the damage among any or all residents of the hall. Any Student who fails to pay for damages assessed will not be permitted to register or graduate, nor will such Student be issued an official transcript, until damage assessments are paid in full.
5. **LIABILITY AND INDEMNIFICATION.** Except as prescribed by the Government Tort Claim Act, the University assumes no liability for personal injury or damage to or loss of property for any reason, including, without limitation: actions of third persons, theft, burglary, assault, vandalism, other crimes, fire, smoke, flood, water leaks, rain or hail, ice or snow, explosions, other phenomena or interruption of utilities. The Student agrees to hold harmless and indemnify the University for any claims or damages payable as a result of the negligence or other acts of the Student. **The University strongly recommends that the Student secure insurance to protect against injury, damage or loss incidental to Residence occupancy.**
6. **ADMINISTRATION & INSPECTION.** The University shall be responsible for performing administrative tasks necessary for the delivery of services included within this agreement and shall perform those duties in an efficient manner. By way of example, the University reserves the right to make room assignments as necessary. From time to time, the University may promulgate rules and regulations for the general safety, welfare and comfort of the entire population of the Residence Hall or Apartment. The Student agrees that any authorized agent to the University may enter the Student's room at any reasonable time for the purpose of inspection and enforcing reasonable rules.
7. **TERMINATION OF STUDENT.** The Student, in any of the following events, may terminate this contract prior to its expiration:
 - a. the Student marries,
 - b. the Student is involved in student teaching out of Lawton and moves off campus,
 - c. the Student has a verifiable medical condition that precludes living on campus.

If this contract is terminated outside of any of these reasons, the following charges will apply:

- a. charges prorated depending on day of the month the lease is terminated
- b. one month's rent, and forfeiture of \$200 deposit.
- c. meal plan charges will be the greater of the dollar amount used by the

resident or the amount the University has been charged by Dining Services.

8. **TERMINATION BY UNIVERSITY.** This contract may be terminated prior to its expiration by the University in any of the following events:
 - a. failure of the Student to pay any charges required when due,
 - b. failure of the Student to be enrolled in a minimum of 12 hours for undergraduate or 6 hours for graduate
 - c. failure of the Student to comply with the terms and conditions of this contract, or
 - d. violation by the Student of any University policy, rule or regulation.

If an individual cancels his/her lease the following charges will apply:

- a. charges prorated depending on day of the month the lease is terminated
- b. one month's rent, and forfeiture of \$200 deposit.
- c. meal plan charges will be the greater of the dollar amount used by the resident or the amount the University has been charged by Dining Services.

In calculating any refund due, the University shall be entitled to a set-off for any amounts due from the Student for any reason.

9. **OTHER RIGHTS OF THE UNIVERSITY.** Upon termination of this contract by the University, the University may reenter and reassign the Student's space. Any property of the Student remaining upon such reentry may be disposed of in the same manner as property abandoned.
10. **REMOVAL OF PROPERTY.** Upon the normal expiration or termination of this contract, the Student shall remove all property from the premises. Any property that remains after checkout or termination shall be deemed abandoned and may be removed and disposed of by the University. The University is under no obligation to provide storage for property abandoned.
11. **UNIVERSITY POLICIES, RULES & REGULATIONS.** At various places in the contract, references are made to the Dates of Occupancy and Conditions of Contract sections which are incorporated into this contract by this reference. Other University publications, such as the Student Handbook, Housing Policies, Rules & Regulations, may also affect the rights and obligations of the Student but are not a written part of this contract. Students must adhere to all University policies.
12. **FOOD SERVICE CONTRACT CANCELLATION:** In the event that a Student's contract is terminated either by the Student or by the University, the Student's meal plan will be terminated at the time of contract cancellation. Meal plan charges will be the greater of the dollar amount used by the resident or the amount the University has been charged by Dining Services.
13. **SUBLETTING.** Under no circumstances will the tenant be allowed to sublet his/her room.
14. **RESERVATION/DAMAGE DEPOSIT:** Any damages to a tenant's apartment or other commons area will be deducted from the \$200 deposit. Any charges beyond the amount of the deposit will be charged to the student's account. The Student agrees to pay, upon demand, for any damage to University property which results from the negligence, carelessness or accident of the Student or the Student's guest(s). If the identity of those responsible for the damage to University property cannot be determined after investigation, the Director of Residence Life or Hall Director, at his or her discretion, may apportion the cost to repair the damage among any or all residents of the Residence Hall or Apartment. Any Student who fails to pay for damages assessed will not be permitted to register or graduate, or be issued an official transcript, until damage assessments are paid in full. The University has the right to withhold from a Student's deposit any charges or fines owed the University including tuition and fees.
15. **GENDER REQUIREMENT:** Only same gender co-tenants will be allowed to rent any Residence Hall or Apartment.
16. **ENTIRE AGREEMENT.** This written contract contains the entire agreement between the Student and the University. No oral agreements have been made, and no amendment to the written contract is valid unless reduced to writing and signed by both the Student and the University. This contract shall be constructed under the laws of the State of Oklahoma, who shall have jurisdiction for its enforcement. Should a court of competent jurisdiction declare any portion of this contract invalid, the remainder shall remain in full force and affect.
17. **PRODIGY POLICY:** An application for on-campus housing by a prodigy student, defined as a student under the age of 17 on the first day of class, will be reviewed on an individual basis. The Office of Residence Life is not obligated to provide housing for prodigy students, but it may do so at its discretion. A parent or legal guardian must sign housing applications for all students who are under the age of 18 by the first day of class.

Payment and Housing Information

MEAL PLANS: There are several meal plans available to Students. These plans are designed to fit most Students' dining needs and include a Basic Meal Plan, Flex Meal Plans, Block Meal Plans, and a Convenience Meal Plan for Apartment residents. The cafeteria serves 19 meals per week – breakfast, lunch, and dinner Monday thru Friday and brunch and dinner on Saturday and Sunday. Meals are not served during Fall Break, Thanksgiving Break, and Spring Break. You may select a 10 meal Basic Plan, 8 meal Flex Plan, 15 Flex Meal Plan, or a 60, 90, 140, or 200 meal Block Plan. Apartment residents may also choose the Convenience Meal Plan. See the meal plan information listed in this contract for more information.

Changes in meal plans can only be made during the first 2 weeks of each semester. Meal plans begin the first day of move-in.

PAYMENT OF CHARGES: As you study the meal plan information, please note that you can pay in full by semester or by installments. If you are getting assistance through the Financial Assistance Office, all your semester housing charges will be paid from any Financial Assistance you may be awarded before you receive any cash. You will not be allowed to make installment payments if you have aid money available to cover the charge. A Student may be approved for an extension of payment if the Student has been approved for financial assistance and is waiting on funds to arrive. Please contact the Office of Residence Life for more information on room and board extensions. **Deposits cannot be included as part of the extension.**

Please note: After the initial payment, all payments are due on the 15th of the month.

DATES OF OCCUPANCY (cont.): Residents may remain in Shepler during holidays, Fall Break, and Spring Break, although stricter visitation rules may be followed for the safety and security of residents who remain on campus. Between semesters, residents may leave their belongings in their room, but they will have to turn in their keys. Keys will be reissued during Spring check-in.

WINTER INTERCESSION AND SUMMER SESSION (SHEPLER RESIDENTS ONLY):

1. To reside in Shepler Center during the Winter Intercession, the student must be a current Shepler resident and have a contract for the Spring 2008 semester.
2. To reside in Shepler Center during the Summer option A, the student must be enrolled full-time during the Spring 2007 and Summer 2008 semester.
3. To reside in Shepler Center during the Summer option B, the student must be enrolled full-time during the Summer 2008 semester.
4. To reside in Shepler Center during the Summer option C, the student must be enrolled full-time during the Summer 2008 and Fall 2008 semester.
5. To reside in Shepler Center during the Summer option D, the student must be enrolled full-time during the Spring 2007, Summer 2008, and Fall 2008 semester.
6. Check-in for Summer 2009 will be the first day of the period.
7. Check-out for Summer 2009 will be the last day of the period.
8. No meal plans are available during these periods.
9. See the Student Handbook for rules and regulations during these periods.

RESERVATIONS: A room cannot be reserved and a Student cannot move in, until the deposit and first payment is made in full. In order to reserve a room, please do the following:

1. Read, complete, and sign the Contract for Residence Life Services and Certification of Meningococcal Compliance.
2. Detach the signed contract and certification page, attach the full or first payment plus the \$200 deposit (please do not send cash), and mail items to:

Payments can also be made at the Cashier's Office located in the Administration Building or at One Stop located in North Shepler. Contracts can also be completed on-line. Room and floor requests will be given preference based upon prior residents' requests and payment received dates. Requests for a single room are based upon availability. Please note that Shepler Center and Cameron Village are smoke-free facilities.

A copy of your signed contract can be picked up the first week of the semester in the Student Housing Office located in 111 McMahon Center.

Meal Plan Information

Please review the meal plan options carefully, so you select a plan that will suit your dining needs. The cost of the meal plans is included in the pricing information contained within this contract. All residents are required to purchase a meal plan each semester while living in University housing. Please contact the Residence Life Office at (580) 581-2392 if you have any questions about the plans or need assistance in making a meal plan selection.

Dining Convenience Plan

Residents of Cameron Village are required to purchase a minimum \$250 per semester Dining Convenience account which can be used to purchase meals in the Student Union Food Court, Shepler dining facilities, or the Campus Brew. Balances in the account do not roll over into the Spring semester, into the Summer, or into a new academic year. Residents also have the option of purchasing any of the meal plans listed below in lieu of the Dining Convenience Plan. **Note: The Dining Convenience Plan is for Cameron Village residents only.**

Basic Meal Plan

There is one basic meal plan option – 10 Meal Plan. The 10 Meal Plan provides a student with 10 meals per week that must be eaten in the Shepler Cafeteria. Meals served in the Shepler Cafeteria are on an all-you-can-eat basis. Unused meals do not roll forward to the next week or semester.

Flex Meal Plans

There are two flex meal plan options that include meals and Flex Cash – Flex 8 Meal Plan and Flex 15 Meal Plan. The flex meal plans provide a specific number of meals (8 or 15) per week that must be eaten in the Shepler Cafeteria. Flex Cash can be used to make food purchases in the Shepler Cafeteria, the Campus Brew, and the Student Union Food Court. Unused meals do not roll forward to the next week or semester. Unused Flex Cash does not roll forward to the next semester.

Block Meal Plans

There are four block meal plan options that include meals and Flex Cash – 60 Block Meal Plan, 90 Block Meal Plan, 140 Block Meal Plan, and the 200 Block Meal Plan. The meals provided with the block meal plans can be used throughout the semester. The meals can be eaten in the Shepler Cafeteria, the Moody Blue Grill, and the Student Union Food Court. In the Moody Blue and the Student Union Food Court, students may select a meal from one of three combo options (not all-you-can-eat). Flex Cash can be used to make food purchases in the Shepler Cafeteria, the Moody Blue Grill, and the Student Union Food Court. Meals with the block plans can be used for guests. Unused meals roll forward from the Fall Semester to the Spring Semester if a student purchases a block meal plan for the Spring Semester. Unused meals at the end of the Spring Semester do not roll forward. Unused Flex Cash does not roll forward to the next semester.
