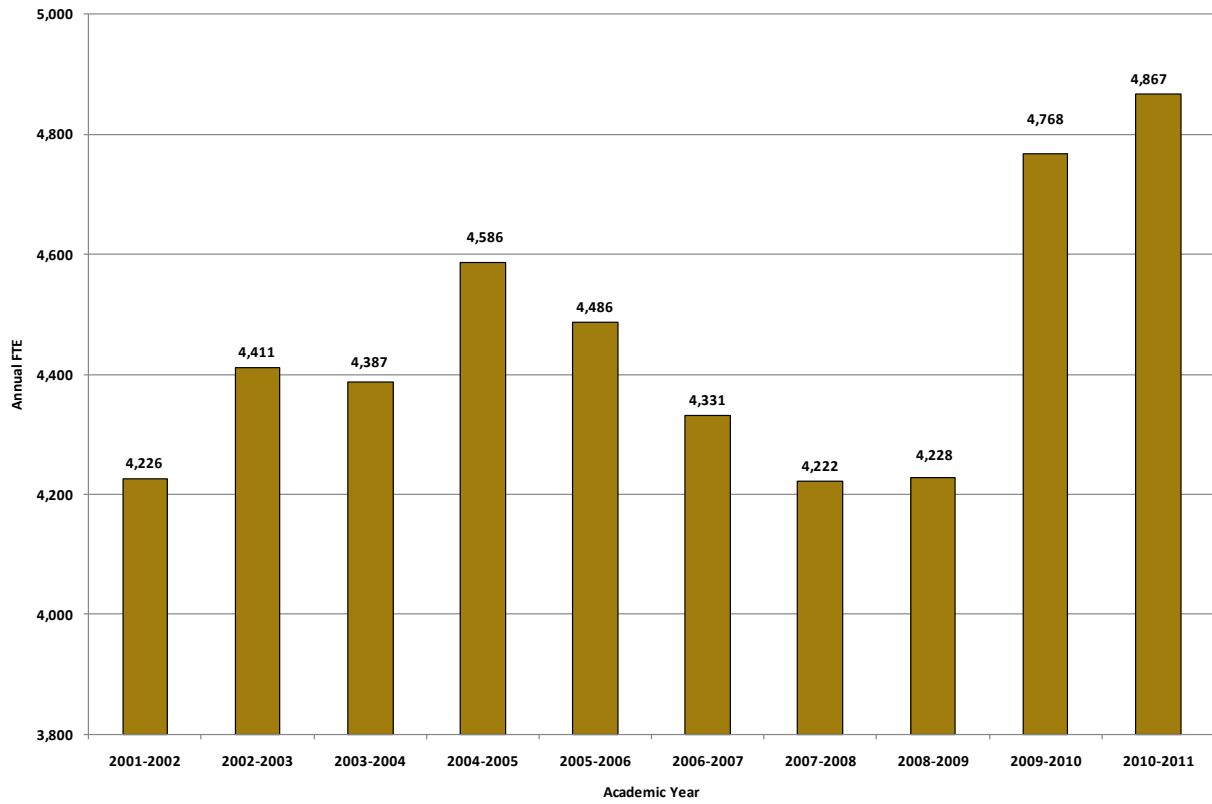

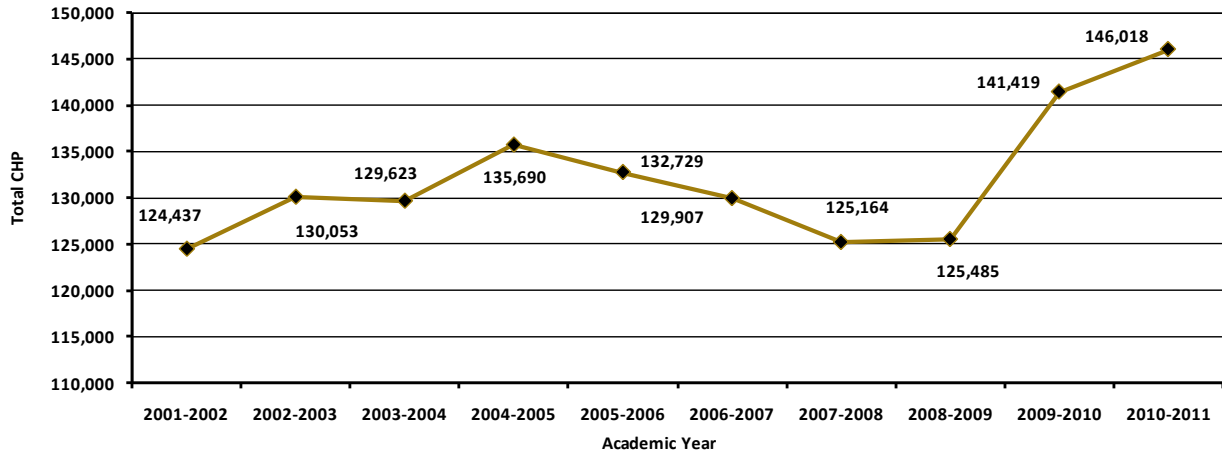
### Annual Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) Enrollment

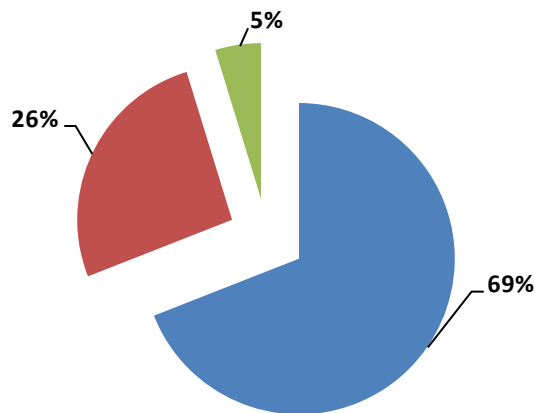

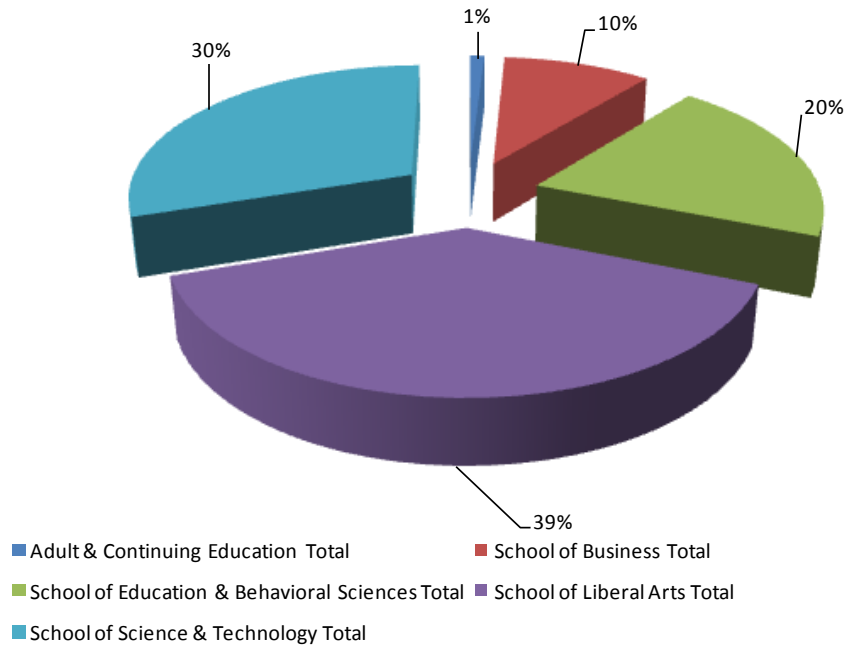

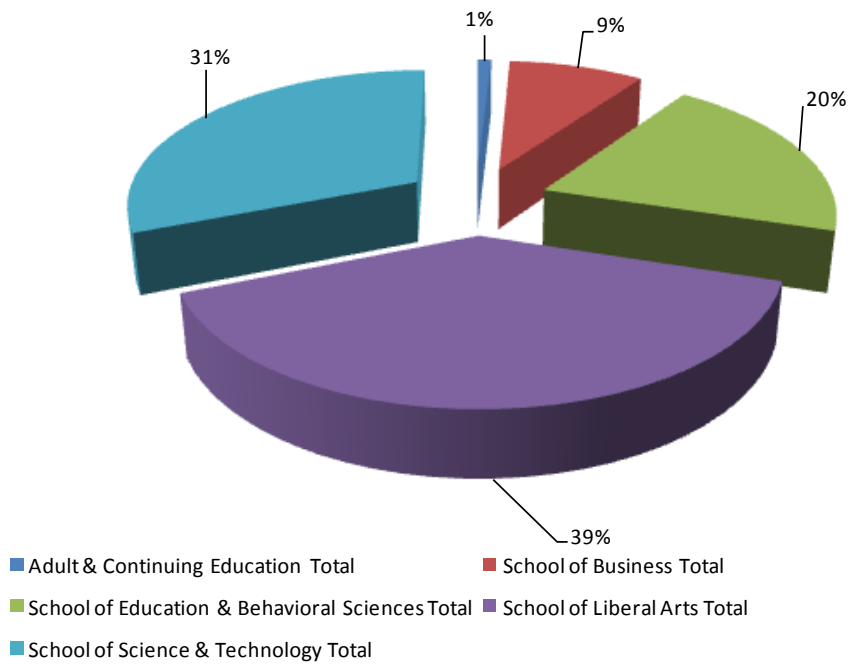

### Student Credit Hour Production by School Academic Year 2010-2011



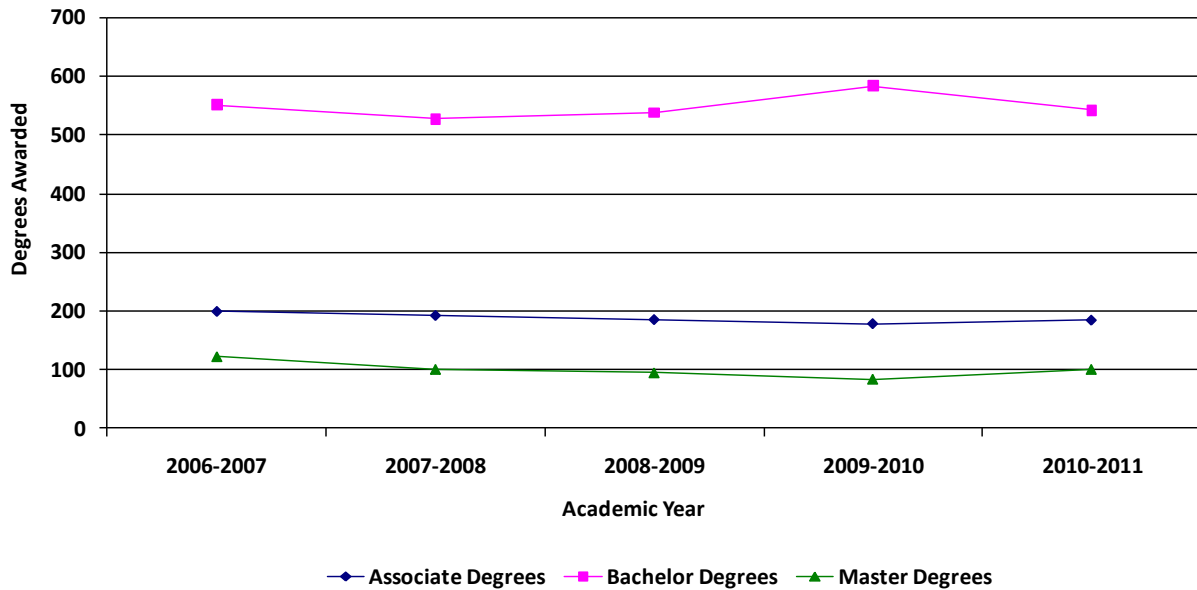

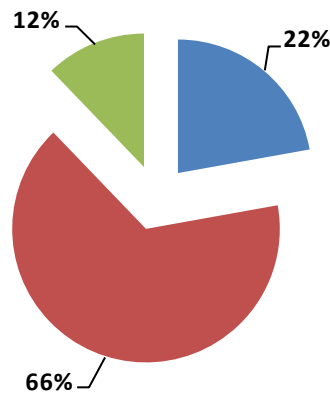

■ Associate Degrees ■ Bachelor Degrees ■ Master Degrees





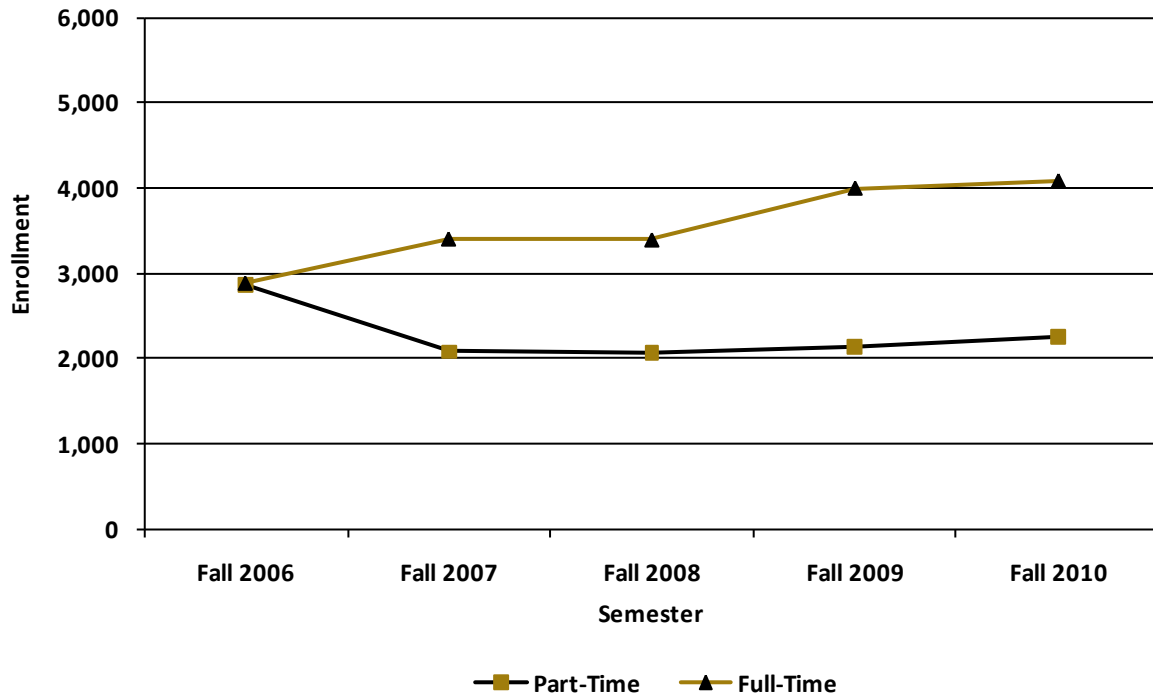

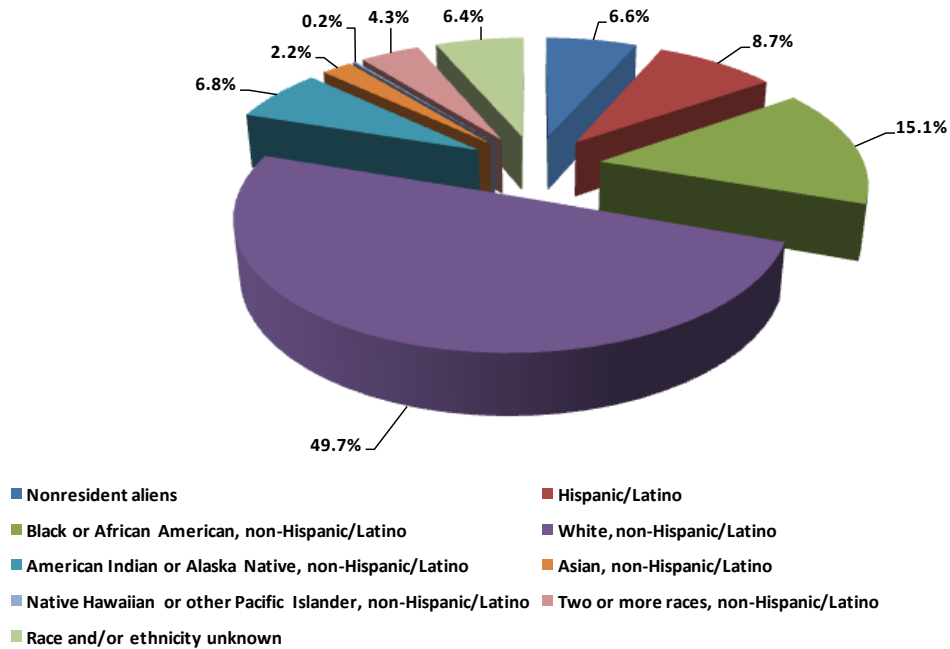

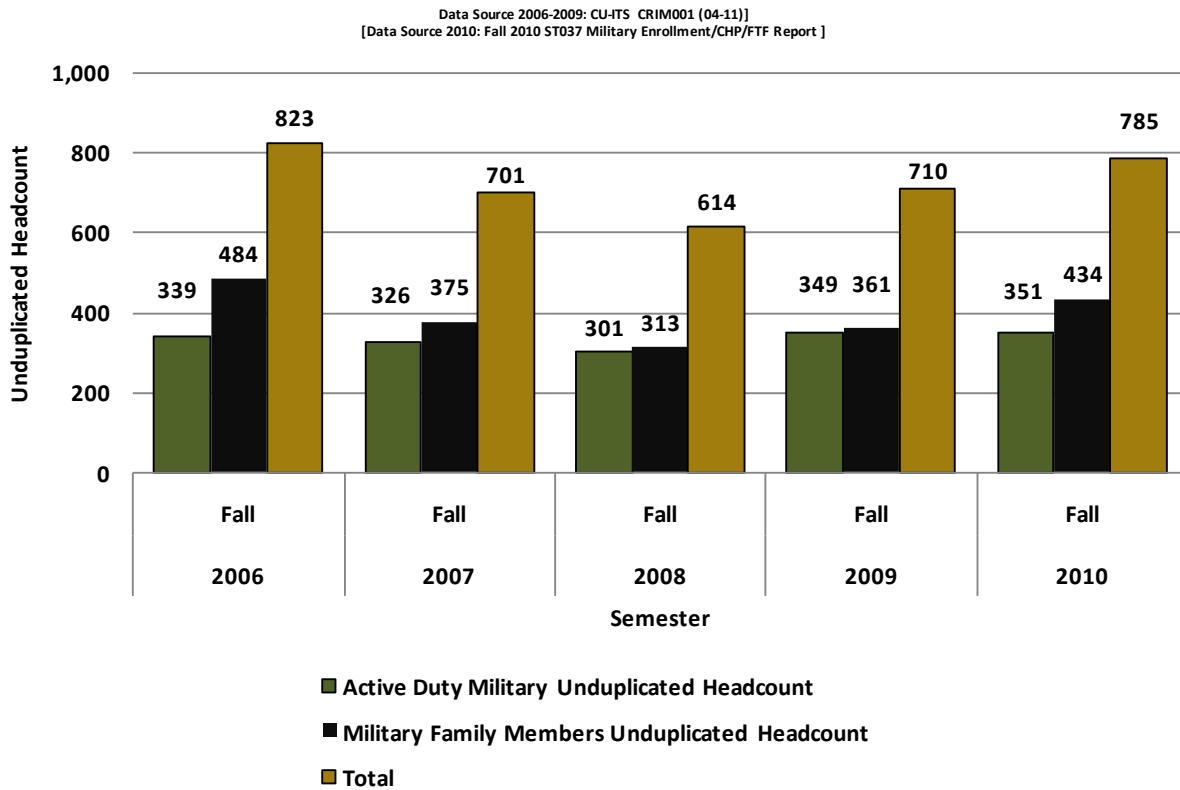

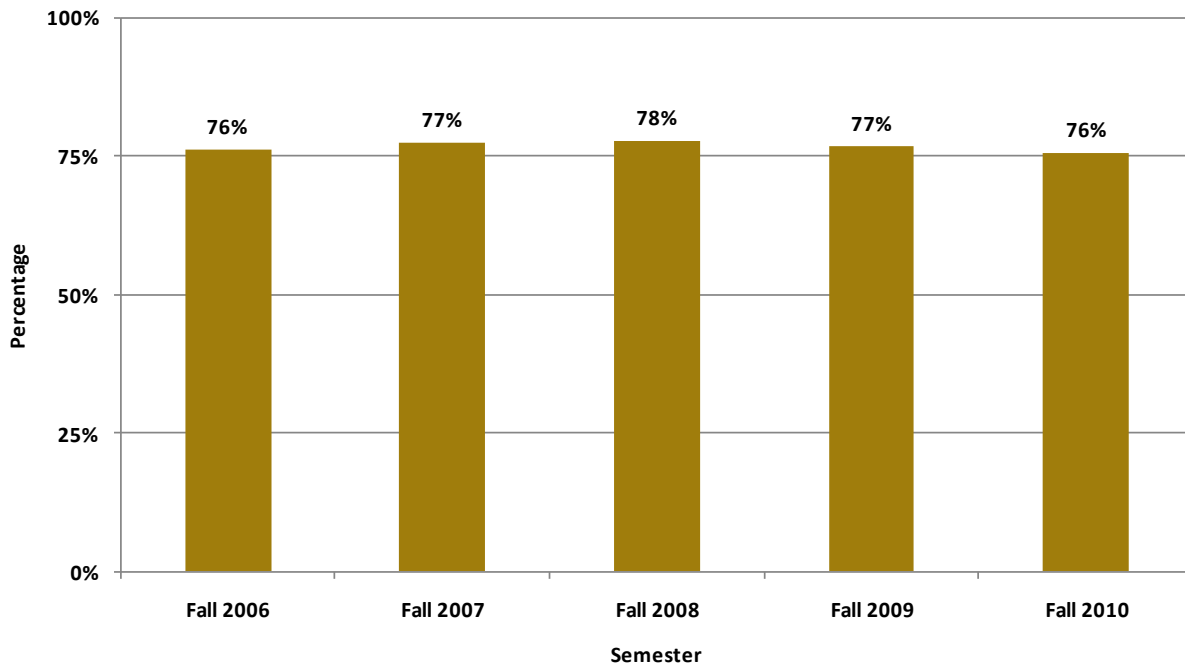

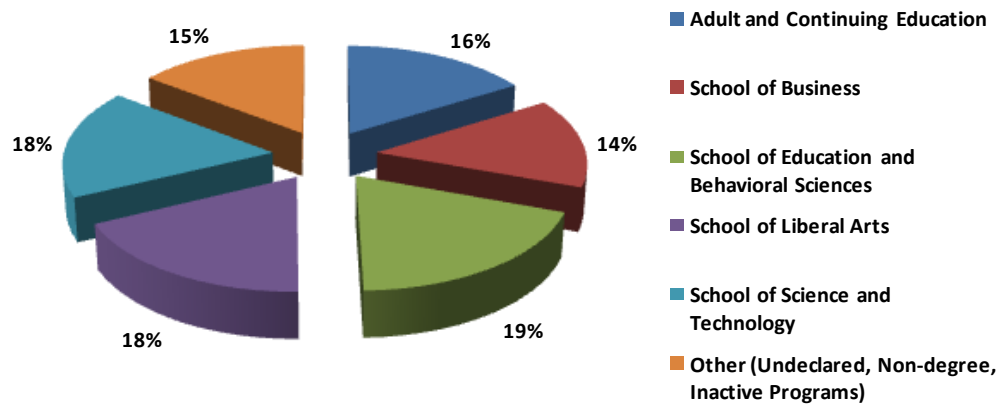

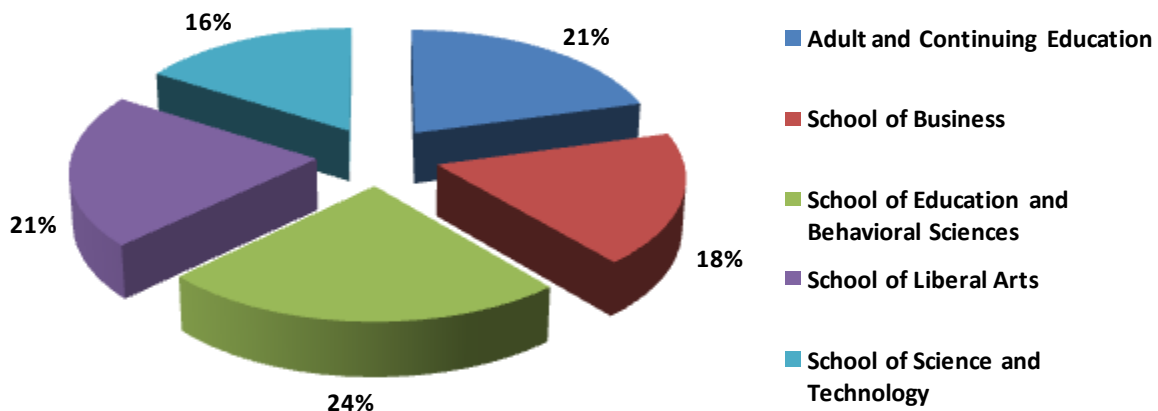

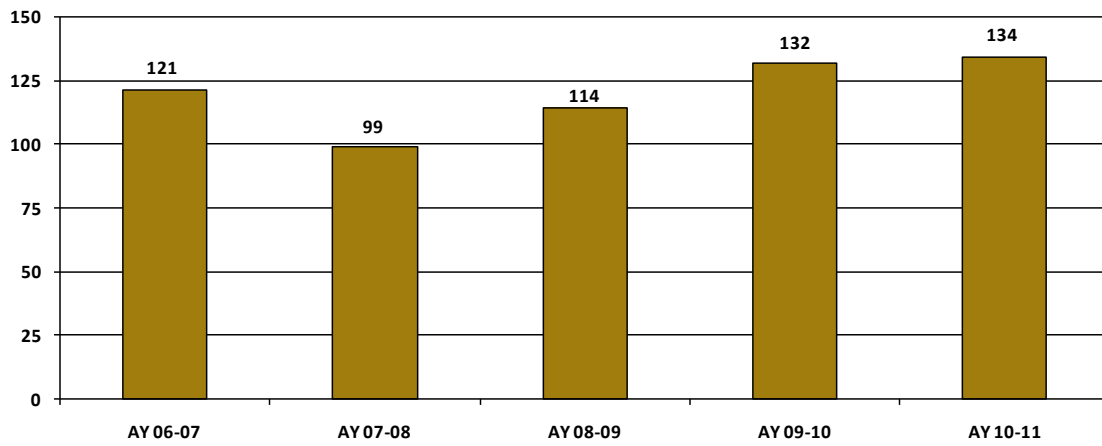

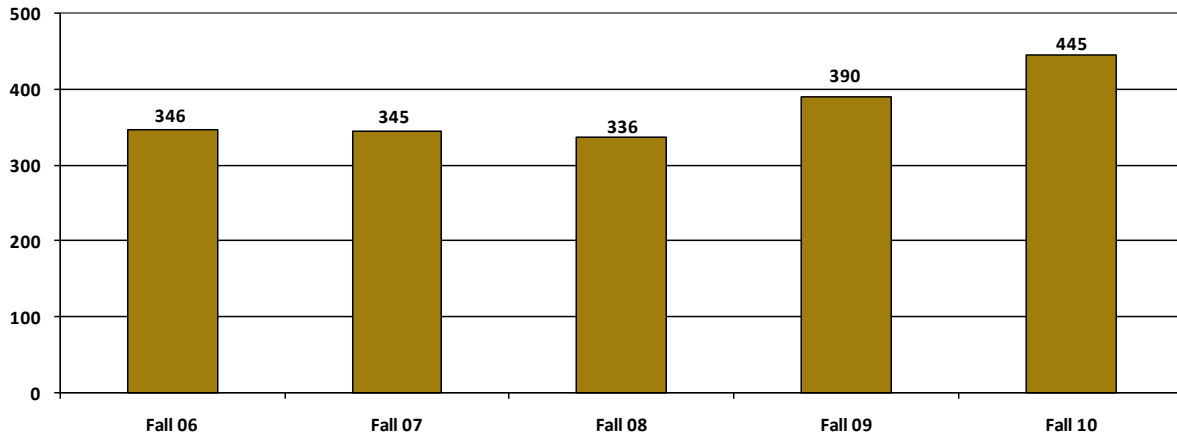

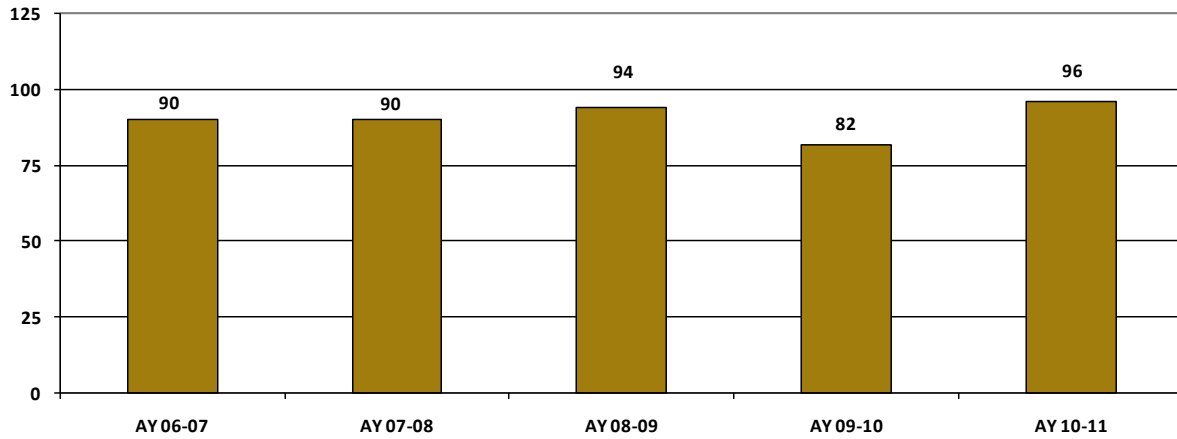




**Graduate Programs**

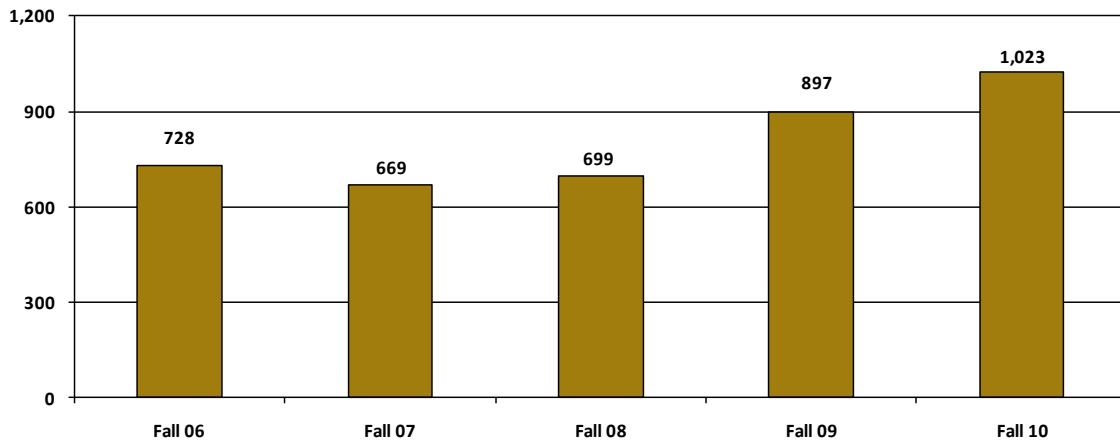

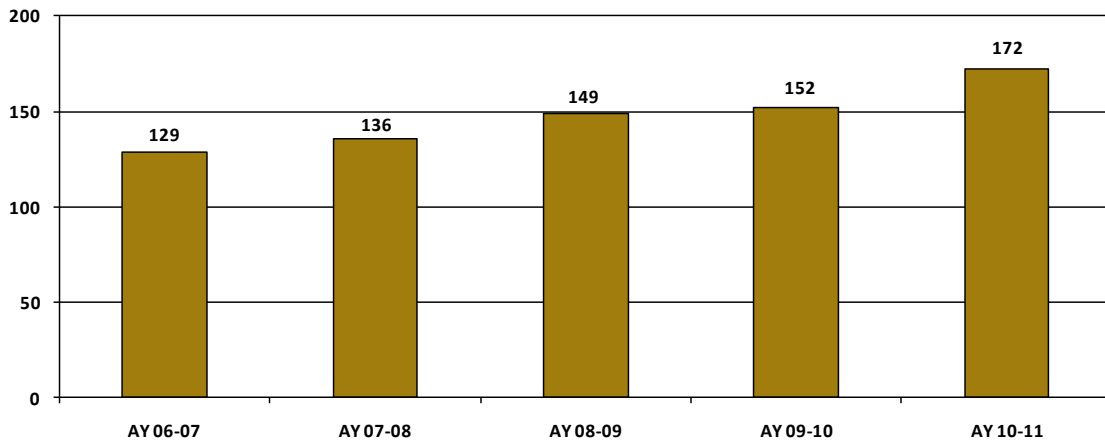

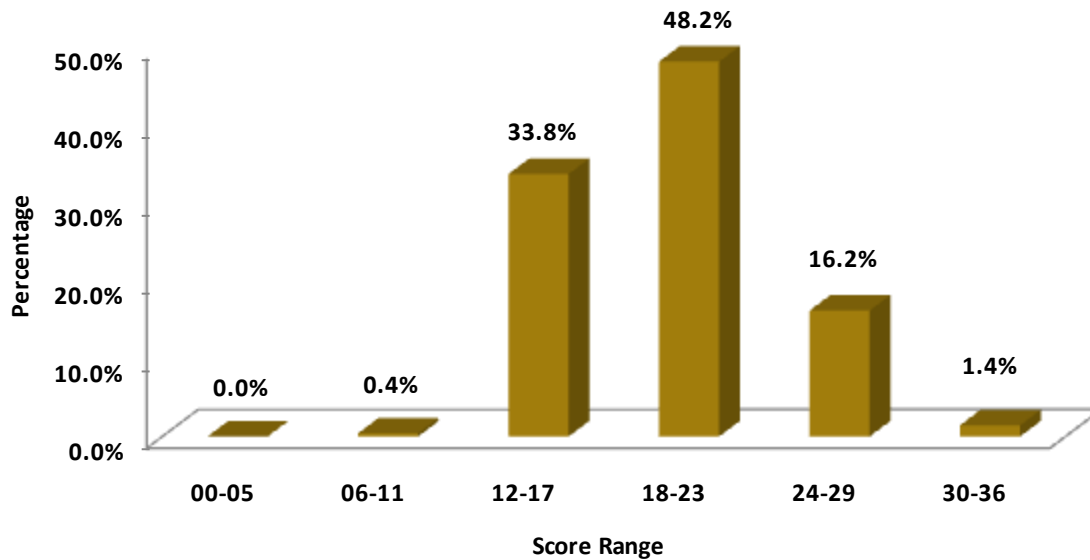

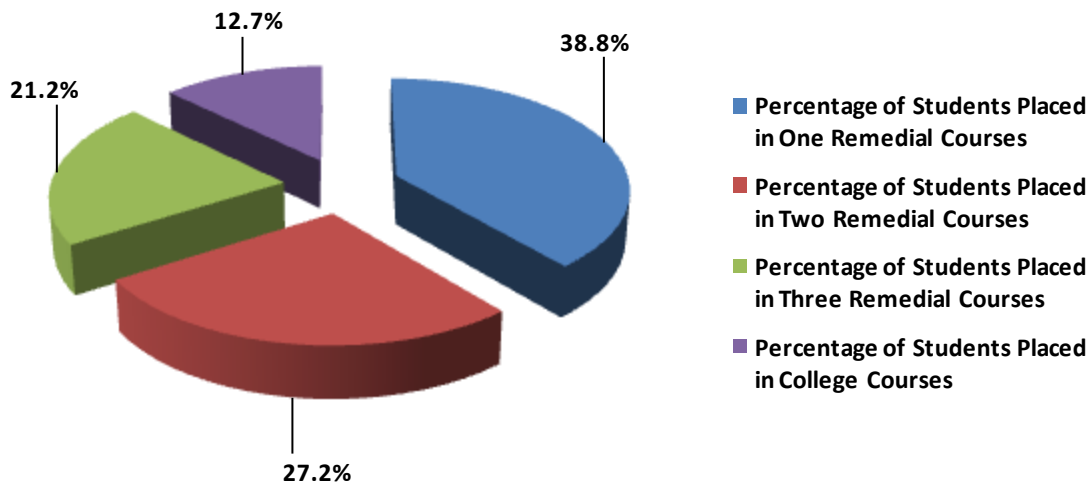

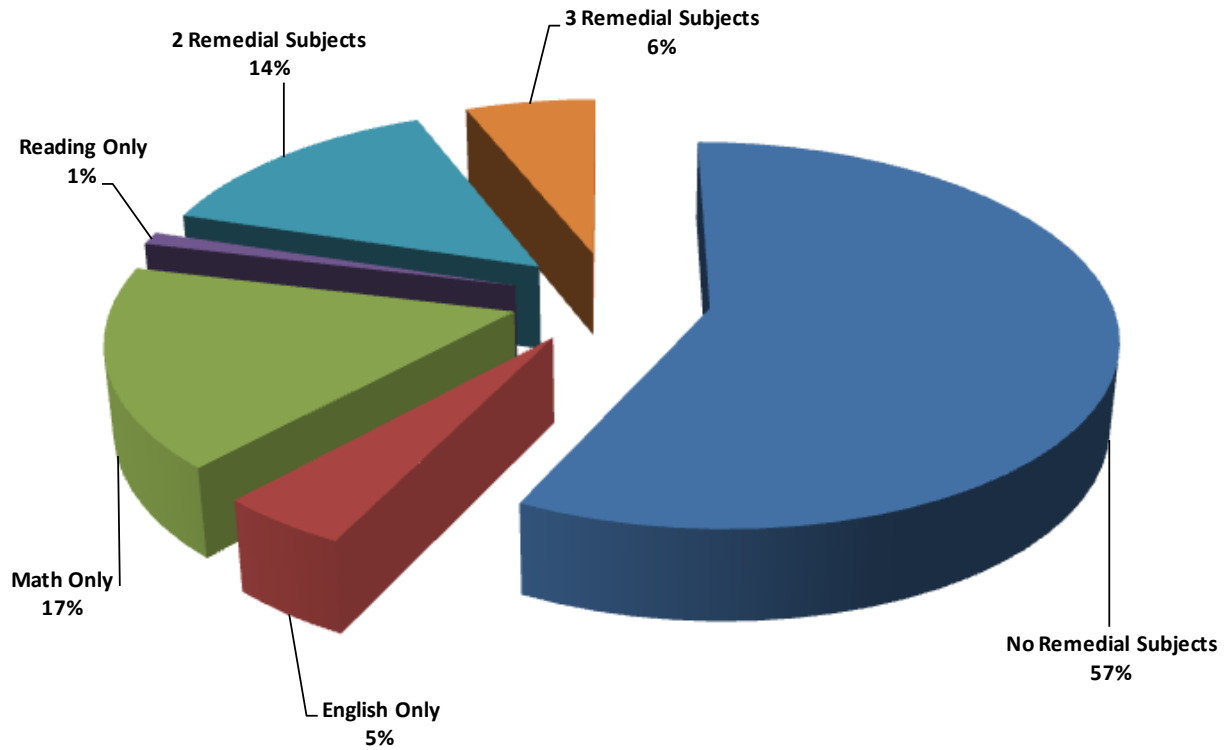
### 2009-2010 Remediation Placement by Secondary Testing
