



Master of Secondary Education, Sports Administration option



This program is offered at Cameron University through a cooperative agreement with East Central University.

The Master of Secondary Education, Sports Administration specialization, is designed to prepare the professional educator for positions as head coach, athletic director, or other administrative positions responsible for directing public school athletic programs. The program is based on a solid foundation in secondary education with specialized courses in athletic administration.

East Central University (ECU) is offering this degree through a cooperative agreement with Cameron University. Cameron University will offer two (2) of the courses. The remaining ten (10) courses must be taken with ECU and are offered in a web-based format. Students in this program must attend two 2 or 3-day seminars on ECU's campus in Ada during the two summers for the cohort group. Students enrolled in KIN 5111 Practicum Portfolio I must attend a June seminar session while students enrolled in KIN 5132 Practicum Portfolio II must attend a July seminar session. The seminars are planned to encompass a weekend and possibly one other weekday. **Students who select this program are encouraged to start the program in the summer and finish by the end of the 2nd summer.** A list of course rotations is attached.

Students who are not currently certified by the Oklahoma State Department of Education can work on certification concurrently with this program.

Each student in this program will be required to complete a professional portfolio and complete practicum hours. The practicum hours are flexible and can be completed by individuals working fulltime.

I. Admission Process

Cameron University (CU)

- Apply online at www.cameron.edu/graduate as **Non-degree Seeking-Education (688)**.
- The \$15 application fee (waived for students who have previously enrolled with Cameron) can be paid online with a credit card, at the Business Office (Administration Building, 101), or at One Stop (North Shepler 121).
- Official transcripts from all institutions you have attended should be taken or sent to the Office of Admissions/Graduate Studies North Shepler 227.
- Interested students may also apply for tuition waiver scholarships through CU's Financial Assistance Office during semesters in which they are enrolled in 6 or more hours at Cameron University. (Applications for school loans should be done through ECU.)
- Students must pass the English proficiency exam or earn a grade of "C" or better in ENGL 5003: English Usage and Composition for Graduate Students.

Sports Administration Program Course Rotation

Through the agreement, students complete 6 graduate hours (2 courses) through Cameron University (courses in bold); the remaining 26 hours must be completed through ECU. **Students should not plan to take any CU courses within their last semester of the program.** Total program is 32 credit hours (12 courses).

This program requires students to attend brief summer sessions on the campus of ECU during each of two summers. Students should work through the cohort group enrollment schedule to be able to complete the program in two summers and a fall and spring semester.

This program is specifically designed to begin in the summer and finish the next summer.
