If you are applying for first-time admission to a United States university, or if you have attended another United States university and earned fewer than 24 semester credit hours, we require ALL of the following documents before processing an I-20:

- ❑ Completed **Application for Admissions AND USD\$35.00 Application fee**. There are NO WAIVERS of application fees.
- ❑ **Evidence of completion of secondary school (high school.)** This must be an official transcript translated into English. If you are from a Caribbean country, we need a **CERTIFIED** or **ORIGINAL** copy of your CXC report. If you are from a West African Nation we need an **ORIGINAL** copy of your WAEC report and a new scratch card with examination number, examination year, and type of examination. All other applicants please inquire as we are in the process of developing guidelines from other countries.
- ❑ **Official transcripts of all university work completed outside the U.S.** and translated into English, and evaluated by an approved credential evaluation agency. These services can be located on the web: www.wes.org or www.jsilney.com. Your credits will not be placed on your CU transcript until you have been fully admitted and enrolled in classes. Advanced Levels do not need to be evaluated.
- ❑ **A copy of the page (or pages) of your passport that indicate your complete name, country of citizenship, passport number, and passport expiration date.**
- ❑ **Affidavit of Financial Support** (enclosed) **AND six months of current bank statements or a statement from a bank** that indicates the availability of funds for you to attend school for at least one year.
- ❑ **TOEFL score report.** If English is not your native language, you are required to take the TOEFL test. Your test score must be 173 or higher for undergraduates and 213 or higher for graduate students (computer-based); 500 or higher for undergraduates and 550 or higher for graduate students (paper-based); and 61 or higher for undergraduates and 79-80 for graduate students (internet-based). The Cameron University code is 6080. Complete information on the TOEFL test can be found at www.toefl.org. We also accept the IELTS. Your test score must be 6.0 for undergraduates and 6.5 for graduate students. Complete information about IELTS can be found at www.ielts.com. **We must have the official score report – NO COPIES.**
- ❑ **SAT score report. If you are under 21 years of age the SAT is required.** The SAT is not required, if you are over 21 years of age OR you have completed at least 24 semester credit hours at the university level. *Please do not submit copies.*

If you are **transferring to CU from another United States high school or university**, please request a transfer form.

CAMERON UNIVERSITY INFORMATION

Cameron University (CU) offers approximately 80 degrees through two-year, four-year and graduate programs. An Associate in Applied Science degree is offered, in computer-aided design drafting, computer information systems, computer information systems, criminal justice, multimedia design, respiratory care, as is an **Associate in Science** degree with concentration in early childhood education and care, interdisciplinary studies, pre-nursing and business.

CU also offers the Bachelor of Accounting, a Bachelor of Arts degrees in art, communications (with concentrations in journalism, public relations, radio/TV, and speech/communication), English, English education, history, international languages, mathematics, mathematics education, music, political science, romance languages, social studies education, and theatre arts; the **Bachelor of Business Administration** degree with concentrations in general business administration, finance, management, and marketing; a **Bachelor of Fine Arts** degree with a concentration in studio art and graphic design; a **Bachelor of Music** degree with concentrations in composition, instrumental music education, instrumental music performance, piano, vocal, and vocal/keyboard; and **Bachelor of Science** degrees in agriculture (concentrations in ag Business, ag mechanization, agronomy, animal science, and environmental science), biology, biology education, chemistry, chemistry education, computer science, criminal justice, early childhood education, elementary education, health and physical education (with concentrations in PE & Health, and sports/fitness management), interdisciplinary studies, medical technology, multimedia design, physics, psychology, sociology, computer information systems, information technology, and technology.

Graduate offerings include a **Master of Arts in Teaching, Master of Science in Behavioral Science or Educational Leadership, Master of Business Administration and Master of Education** with concentrations in early childhood education, elementary education, reading specialist, secondary education, special education and alternate program. CU operates on a two-semester calendar. The fall semester usually begins in mid-August and ends in mid-December. The spring semester, which includes a one-week recess in March, begins in mid-January and ends in early May.

CU is a multipurpose university located in Lawton, the state of Oklahoma's fourth largest city (with a population of more than 100,000). Lawton is approximately 90 miles from Oklahoma City, 190 miles from Tulsa and 200 miles from Dallas, Texas. The university's mission is to offer educational programs to approximately 250,000 people living in an 11-county service region in Southwest Oklahoma. Cameron is one of seven regional universities in Oklahoma and is the only institution in its service area offering associate, bachelor and master degrees.

While academics are a priority at CU, an important part of the college experience takes place outside the classroom. Students can find activities that suit their talents, interests and abilities. A wide range of organizations is located on campus, including departmental, minority, professional, political and religious groups and various honorary and recognition societies. Students can become involved in student government, choral groups, a jazz ensemble, theatre or Greek life.

During their free time, students can participate in intramural sports, intercollegiate athletics and other recreational activities. The CU Fitness Center houses basketball, volleyball and racquetball courts, and NCAA regulation-size swimming pool, a running track, aerobic exercise area and a weight training area, which features cross-training equipment. Located nearby are eight tennis courts. Use of the fitness facility is open to CU students, staff and faculty. Intercollegiate sports are an important part of campus life. Men play basketball, baseball, golf, country and tennis, while women participate in basketball, volleyball, softball, golf and tennis. Cameron competes in the NCAA Division II Lone Star Conference.

Student Population

Cameron has an enrollment of approximately 6,000 full and part-time students each fall and spring semester. The summer semester has a small enrollment. Minority students make up 38% of the total enrollment. The current breakdown is as follows: 19% African-American, 8% Native-American, 8% Hispanic and 3% Asian. The current international student body represents approximately 280 students from 45 different countries.

Faculty

Approximately 68 percent of the faculty holds doctoral degrees or the highest degree offered in their fields; 194 full-time faculty members and 50 adjunct professors teach courses. The student-faculty ration is 23 to 1. There are no graduate or teaching assistants teaching classes at CU.

Housing Information

Shepler Center is comprised of two traditional high-rise residence halls – North Shepler (male) and South Shepler (female). Each room is equipped with a bed, desk, high-speed internet, cable and phone connections. Bathroom and shower facilities are available on each floor. A lounge is located on each floor of the residential halls. Students will find a laundry facility, cafeteria, coffee shop, grill, and a 24-hour computer lab conveniently located between the towers. North Shepler also offers suites for mail students. These suites are 2, 3, or 4 bedroom and include a living area.

Cameron Village is an apartment complex with two styles of apartments. One is set up as a four bedroom/two bath unit. The other style is a two bedroom/one bath floor plan. All apartments are furnished and include kitchens with a microwave, stove, dishwasher and refrigerator. The Village also is equipped with high-speed internet, cable and phone connections. Located in Cameron Village is the McMahan Center – a separate building with a great room, recreational space, library and computer room. More Information

CU is rated a superior education value by *Critical Comparisons of American Colleges and Universities* – an award given to fewer than 7% of U.S. universities. The award recognizes schools that hold the line against spiraling tuition costs.

The university ranks in the top 10 percent of the nation's safest campuses, and is the **safest campus in Oklahoma**, according to the U.S. crime statistics. CU conducts ongoing educational programs and maintains such services as neighborhood watch and "crimestoppers" programs, uniformed nighttime campus escorts for students, a 24-hour emergency hotline and improved nighttime lighting.

Living up to its title as "Oklahoma's Interactive University", Cameron maintains an award-winning website (www.cameron.edu) that features online admission, class schedules and interactive courses.

United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) regulations require documentation that sufficient financial resources are available to meet a student’s prospective educational and living expenses while in the U.S. Therefore, Cameron University requires a guarantee of financial resources from each applicant who expects to obtain or maintain F-1 (student) visa status. Applicants are required to submit documentation that shows financial resources that **equal or exceed one year of expenses** for the program of study they are interested in pursuing. **A Certificate of Eligibility (USCIS Form I-20) will not be issued until this information is provided.**

This estimate is based upon **15** semester hours each semester for undergraduate studies; this is the average number of hours taken by international students. (NOTE: Undergraduates are required by USCIS to complete 12 credit hours each semester, for the Fall and Spring semesters. International students are free to take more than 12 credit hours per semester and they may also take courses in the summer.) **Housing cost** is calculated at the highest room and meal plan. The cost estimate below **does not include costs for tuition, books, fees, lodging, meals, or other expenses for the summer months.**

Scholarships and on-campus jobs available to international students are very limited. International students should not rely on scholarship funds or work-study jobs to finance their educational costs. International students may not apply for scholarships or work-study jobs until they are admitted to CU.

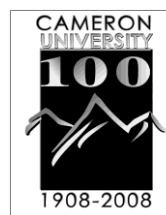

NON-RESIDENT TUITION WAIVER AVAILABLE



The Non-resident tuition waivers allow students to pay the same tuition rate as a resident of Oklahoma. This is a substantial savings.

Any international student undergraduate is eligible for the non-resident tuition waiver in their first semester if at least one of the following criteria are met:

1. Prospective undergraduate students from **Caribbean nations or British educational systems** **only**: If student has completed five CXC passes at Levels I or II (or Level III if June 1998 or later) **AND** two A-Level or CAPE passes, student is eligible for this waiver.
2. Student has not taken any university-level courses at a foreign university, but has obtained an SAT composite math and critical reading score of 1020 or higher.
3. Student must have their credits earned at a foreign university evaluated by an approved credential evaluation service (except A-Levels, which are evaluated in this office). If the student has earned a GPA of 3.0 or above based upon the evaluation, they will also be eligible to receive the waiver.

The services that are recognized by CU are WES (www.wes.org), J. Silny (www.jsilny.com), Educational Credential Evaluators (www.ece.org), Education Evaluators International, Inc (www.edueic.com), and AACRAO's International Education Services, (www.aacrao.org).

The student is responsible for paying for this service and should contact the evaluation service directly to have their transcripts evaluated.

Remember, even if you do not qualify for the non-resident tuition waiver during your first semester at Cameron, you have the opportunity to earn the waiver by making a 3.0 GPA or better during your **first** semester at Cameron. Most international students study hard and make good grades, so more than 90% of our international students have earned the waiver. To continue receiving the waiver, the student must maintain a 2.5 GPA.

Graduate students can receive the non-resident tuition waiver if they are transferring a GPA of 3.0. To continue receiving the waiver, the student must maintain a 3.6 GPA.

The *approximate* cost to attend Cameron University for *one academic year* (one academic year includes the Fall and Spring Semesters) is outlined in the following paragraphs. This estimate does not reflect any tuition, fees, lodging, meal, or other expenses for the summer months. You will need to allow money for returning home or living in the States during the summer (mid-May to mid-August).

This estimate is not a fixed cost; it is merely a tool for you to use to budget your expenses for your first year at Cameron. *Each student's circumstances will be somewhat different, resulting in different living expenses.* If you take more or fewer classes each semester, your tuition amounts will vary. If you have a roommate or live off-campus, you can expect to pay different expenses for lodging and meals.

The cost of medical care in the U.S. is very high. Even a short visit to the doctor can be very expensive. All international students are required to enroll in the Student Health Insurance Plan. The insurance premium will be automatically assessed to your university account. In order for international students to waive coverage, students must complete and submit a waiver form with proof of comparable coverage prior to the waiver deadline date after enrolling in classes at Cameron.

International students are required by the U.S. Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services (US-CIS) to be enrolled "full-time." At Cameron, full-time enrollment for undergraduates is satisfied by completion of a minimum of 12 credit hours each Fall and Spring semester; graduate students must complete 9 hours per semester. You are not required to attend school during the summer, but you may attend the 8-week summer session.

RECEIVING NON-RESIDENT TUITION WAIVER

The **tuition with non-resident waiver** reflects a **substantial savings** offered by Cameron University to international students with superior college preparation work. Any international student may present documentation for review to determine eligibility for this waiver. Transcripts must be translated into English and evaluated by a recognized foreign credentials evaluation service. (Information on these services is available from the CU International Student Services Office.) This waiver sets aside the non-resident portion of tuition normally charged to international students. You must maintain at least a 2.5 GPA (**Grade Point Average**) to continue receiving this waiver each semester. Failure to do so will result in losing the waiver. If the waiver is not awarded for **the first** semester at Cameron, an international student is eligible for the waiver after completion of THE FIRST semester with a 3.0 or higher GPA (3.6 or higher for graduate students).

The *approximate* cost to attend Cameron University for *one academic year* (an academic year includes the Fall and Spring Semesters) is outlined in the following paragraphs. This estimate does not reflect any tuition, fees, lodging, meals, or other expenses for the summer months. You will need to allow money for returning home or living in the States during the summer (mid-May to mid-August).

This estimate is not a fixed cost; it is merely a tool to help you budget your expenses for your first year at Cameron. *Each student's circumstances will be somewhat different, resulting in different living expenses.* If you take more or fewer classes each semester, your tuition amounts will vary.
