Your 2022-2023 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) was selected for review in a process called verification. We will compare the data on your FAFSA with the information on this worksheet, and with any other required documents. If there are discrepancies, the Office of Financial Assistance may contact you for further clarification or additional documentation in order to make corrections.

You and your parent(s) must complete and sign this worksheet, attach any required documents, and submit the form to our office. VERIFICATION CANNOT BE COMPLETED AND FINANCIAL AID CANNOT BE AWARDED UNTIL ALL NECESSARY DOCUMENTATION HAS BEEN RECEIVED AND VERIFIED BY OUR OFFICE.
